Habema Soldiers Taught Bombam Children To Sing National Songs

Responding to the Komsos, one of the children named Alex Menjeh enthusiastically said, "Thank you, Om Tentara (Soldier). I remember the National Songs again. Long live Indonesia." The children's enthusiasm and quick learning inspire hope for the future.
